



DISABILITY HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS PROCEDURES & GUIDELINES COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER CAMPUS

In compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Columbia University provides reasonable accommodations to students with disabilities in housing. **A disability is defined as any mental or physical impairment that substantially limits the individual in a major life activity compared to the average person, according to the ADA.** For students whose disabilities substantially limit their ability to live in Columbia's traditional housing arrangements, accommodations are provided.

Housing accommodations are determined on a case-by-case basis, according to documented need. These accommodations are made after a determination of the student's disability status and that his or her particular disability necessitates adjustments to the living environment and available housing options. With this in mind, the University has established the following procedures to ensure that students with disabilities have equal access to Columbia's housing resources.

Students must apply for housing through the regular process dictated by their school/program while simultaneously applying for disability related accommodations.

Please note: Students who do not qualify for disability housing accommodations may also apply for an assignment or a transfer to a location that may better address their preferences through standard housing procedures. Procedures:

1. Follow general procedures for housing, including relevant applications. Consult the CUMC Office of Housing Services (<http://www.cumc-housing.columbia.edu/>) for details. Procedures vary depending on school and current housing status. If approved for disability housing accommodations, the Office of Housing Services will provide an assignment that includes all approved accommodations.
2. Submit completed *Disability Housing Accommodations Request* form (attached) and disability documentation to the Office of Disability Services (ODS).

Documentation must:

- a. **Be recent in order to assess the current and substantial impact on a major life activity.**
- b. **Be sufficient to establish a direct link between the underlying impairment and the requested housing accommodation.**
- c. **Otherwise meet ODS guidelines for disability documentation** (refer to www.health.columbia.edu/ods for disability documentation guidelines)

****If you are requesting housing accommodations due to asthma or allergy conditions, you must submit the *Verification of Disability Form for Asthma and Allergy Conditions* (refer to www.health.columbia.edu/ods for this form)**

3. Requests will be considered by the Committee on Disability Housing Accommodations (the “Committee”), which is comprised of Columbia staff from Disability Services, Primary Care Medical Services, Counseling and Psychological Services, and Housing. The Committee evaluates, among other things, the student’s disability status, the necessity of the requested accommodations, potential alternative accommodations and what, if any, housing accommodations would be appropriate for the student. Students are informed of the status of their request by the Committee as soon as reasonably possible. Please note that the Committee meets on a monthly basis.
4. All requests for disability housing accommodations, along with all of the required documentation and forms referenced above, must be submitted to the Office of Disability Services by the following dates:
 - a. Entering first year P&S medical students: April 15th
 - b. Entering ETP Nursing students: March 1st
 - c. All other entering, first year students: June 1st
 - d. Couples Housing: June 1st

While applications submitted after these dates will be accepted and considered, Columbia cannot guarantee that it will be able to meet late applicants’ accommodation needs, including any needs that develop during the semester.

Students must submit updated documentation if requesting additional accommodations.

Incomplete applications or those without disability documentation will not be considered.

5. Students will receive a direct assignment from the Office of Housing Services that includes all approved disability accommodations. Students who wish to move or change housing locations after this initial assignment should contact the Office of Housing Services to explore options. However, our first priority is to accommodate your disability-related housing accommodations, and then to meet your housing style preferences.
6. Students who are not granted housing accommodations through this process will have the opportunity to appeal such decisions. All appeals are reviewed by Dr. Samuel Seward, Assistant Vice President. Students will receive information about the appeals process upon notification of decision of request for disability housing accommodations.

REQUEST FORM FOR DISABILITY HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS

Columbia University is deeply committed to the full participation of students with disabilities in all aspects of University life, including residential life. With this in mind, the University has established procedures to ensure that students with disabilities have equal access to Columbia's housing resources. Please refer to the *Disability Housing Accommodations Procedures* for the complete process for requesting disability-related housing accommodations, including deadlines. Students must follow these procedures and provide all of the required information in order to be considered for disability housing accommodations.
