



DISABILITY HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS PROCEDURES & GUIDELINES

In compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Columbia University provides reasonable accommodations to students with disabilities in housing. A disability is defined as any mental or physical impairment that substantially limits the individual in a major life activity compared to the average person, according to the ADA. For students whose disabilities substantially limit their ability to live in Columbia's traditional housing arrangements, accommodations are provided.

Housing accommodations are determined on a case-by-case basis, according to documented need, and prevailing standards for reasonable accommodations. These accommodations are made after a determination of the student's disability status and that his or her particular disability necessitates adjustments to the living environment and available housing options. With this in mind, the University has established the following procedures to ensure that students with disabilities have equal access to Columbia's housing resources.

Please note: Students who have medical conditions that do not constitute a disability may also apply for an assignment or a transfer to a location that may better address their special needs through standard housing procedures. Columbia College and Engineering undergraduate students should contact the Office of Housing and Dining (<http://www.columbia.edu/cu/housing/> 212.854.2775) for information on this process. Graduate, General Studies, and SEAS combined- plan transfer students should contact University Apartment Housing (<http://www.columbia.edu/cu/ire/> 212.854.9300).

Procedures:

1. Follow general procedures for housing, including relevant applications. Consult UAH or Undergraduate Office of Housing and Dining for information regarding these processes. Students must be otherwise eligible for University housing in order to be eligible for housing accommodations, including enrollment in a housing eligible program, School approval, and be a full-time student.

Undergraduate CC and SEAS students must register for housing lottery to guarantee housing assignment. If approved for a disability housing accommodation, the lottery registration will be voided (details below). Graduate and General Studies students must complete UAH housing application. If approved for a disability housing accommodation, UAH will provide housing assignment that meets disability needs.

2. Submit completed *Disability Housing Accommodations Request* form and disability documentation (refer to www.health.columbia.edu/ods for disability documentation guidelines).
3. Requests will be considered by the Committee on Disability Housing Accommodations (the "Committee"), which is comprised of staff from the offices of Disability Services, Housing and Dining, University Apartment Housing, Residential Programs, General Studies Dean of

Students, and several of Columbia's staff physicians. The Committee evaluates, among other things, the student's disability status, the necessity of the requested accommodations, potential alternative accommodations and what, if any, housing accommodations would be appropriate for the student. Students are informed of the status of their request by the Committee as soon as reasonably possible. Please note that the Committee meets on a monthly basis.

4. All requests for disability housing accommodations, along with all of the required documentation and forms referenced above, must be submitted to the Office of Disability Services by the following dates:
 - a. Columbia College and SEAS incoming first year students:
May 1st for Fall semester and November 1st for Spring semester
 - b. All other Columbia College and SEAS:
February 1st for Fall semester and November 1st for Spring semester
 - c. Graduate, Professional and General Studies undergraduate students:
June 1st for Fall semester and November 1st for Spring semester.
 - d. SEAS Combined-plan transfer:
June 30th for Fall semester and November 1st for Spring semester.

While applications submitted after these dates will be accepted and considered, Columbia cannot guarantee that it will be able to meet late applicants' accommodation needs, including any needs that develop during the semester.

Columbia College and undergraduate Engineering Students must re-apply for disability housing accommodations each year and submit new disability documentation.

Graduate and General Studies undergraduate students must submit updated documentation if requesting additional accommodations.

Incomplete applications or those without disability documentation will not be considered.

5. CC and SEAS undergraduates who have been approved for specific housing accommodations by the Committee are not eligible to participate in the Housing Lottery/ Room Selection process and will receive a housing assignment that meets their needs. In addition to housing accommodations, students requesting suite style housing who have a group of students with whom they would like to live must indicate this on their *Disability Housing Accommodations Request Form*. Housing assignments are made according to class standing. **Please note that housing assignments are binding for that housing period. A student who requests housing through this process cannot decline an assignment in favor of Lottery participation. Requests for room changes to another location will be considered during the Office of Housing and Dining transfer period.**

Graduate and General Studies undergraduate students will receive a direct assignment from UAH that includes all approved disability accommodations. Students who wish to move or

change housing locations after this initial assignment should contact UAH via email at UAH@columbia.edu to explore options.

6. Students who are not granted housing accommodations through this process will have the opportunity to appeal such decisions. All appeals are reviewed by the Assistant Vice-President for Health Services. Students will receive information about the appeals process upon notification of decision of request for disability housing accommodations.
