What type of plan is the Aetna Student Health plan?

Who do I see if I have a medical concern?

How can I make an appointment?

 What if I have my own insurance and not the Aetna Student Health plan?

# Care Starts at Medical Services

- Routine and urgent medical care, travel medicine, immunizations, sexual health services, reproductive and gynecological services, LGBTQ health care, and confidential HIV testing.
- Acupuncture and sports medicine services available.
- Receive referrals for offcampus specialists



# Columbia University Student Health Insurance

- Students are enrolled in an Aetna Open Choice PPO plan
- Insurance is effective beginning August 15
- A student must obtain a referral from Medical Services before seeking care off campus
- Medical referrals are valid from August 15 August 14 of the following year

#### FYI

- Medical referrals need to be renewed annually (plan year is August 15 August 14 of the following year)
- CPS referrals do not need to be renewed if you remain on the Aetna Health Student Plan from year to year

 If you visit Urgent Care or the ER, make sure you return to Medical Services to get a referral for any related follow-up care

# Understanding Insurance Basics

# **Getting Started**

- Insurance seems more complicated than it is
- Participate in the 20 minute insurance workshops offered monthly – if they aren't what you are looking for, jump off til the next one
- Watch for monthly info emails if you are on the Aetna plan.
- Understand key words: PCP, deductible, co-pay, coinsurance, in-network, referral, maximum out of cost, EOB
- Ask for help!

#### The Columbia Aetna Student Health Plan

- No-cost visits to on-campus Medical Services and CPS
- \$0 deductible (in-network)\*
- \$30 co-pay for in-network lab, x-rays, etc.\*

\*With a Referral from Medical Services or CPS

\*\*First 10 visits at no co-pay

- \$20 co-pay\*\* for in-network, offcampus mental health visits\*
- \$30 co-pay for off-campus specialist\*
- 10% co-insurance for other services\*
- \$60 co-pay for Urgent Care visit
- \$150 co-pay for ER visit
- \$50 Ambulance transport

# What is a claim?

#### Claims

A claim is what is filed to obtain reimbursement for a provided procedure

In-Network claims are filed directly to Aetna by the provider

 Out-of-Network claims require a claim form to be completed and submitted to Aetna with supporting documentation for processing, usually done by the student

# Open Enrollment

#### What is Open Enrollment and Why is it Important?

- Open Enrollment (OE) is the time during which you can enroll in or waive an insurance plan.
- CU OE begins July 15 and runs through September 30!
- The plan year begins August 15, regardless of when you enroll during the OE window.
- Insurance is highly regulated. You must have a Qualifying Life Event (QLE) in order to make a change outside of the OE period.

### Enroll/Waive through the Patient Portal

Open enrollment July 15 – September 30, 2024

Take Action!

Students should enroll or provide appropriate documentation to request a waiver

 If you do not enroll or waive prior to September 30, you will be enrolled onto the plan by default

#### How do I Know I Successfully Enrolled?

- Once completed, you will see a pop-up before exiting the system stating your enrollment request was successful
- Your Patient Portal will show your status as "Compliant" next to Insurance Enrollment

 Approximately one week following enrollment, you will receive an email confirming enrollment

# How Can I Get A Copy of My ID Card?

- You will need to be Registered for Class, Enrolled in Insurance AND Billed tuition before your insurance will become active.
- The plan year begins August 15, 2024.
- ID cards are available once your plan is active on or after August 15, 2024.
- Download ID card from <u>www.aetnastudenthealth.com</u> using your UNI and date of birth.

#### Waiver Requirements 2024-2025

- Columbia University requires any alternate insurance plans to meet all University requirements
- Requirements are clearly stated on the Checklist
- Insurance is highly regulated there are no exceptions made for requirements not being met
- Plans will not be reviewed unless all documentation is included at the time of submission for a waiver
- All updates on status will be found in secure messages in your Patient Portal

### Medical Evacuation and Repatriation\*

\* Required for all visa-holders (anyone who is not a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident)

- This requirement may be met via a secondary coverage plan for evacuation and repatriation only.
- Minimum coverage requirements of \$50,000 for medical evacuation and \$25,000 for repatriation
- Plan must cover you for the full plan year August 15, 2024 August 14, 2025
- Must submit documentation detailing dates and coverage amounts

# 2024-2025 Plan Enhancements

#### New Benefits this Plan Year

- Mail order pharmacy now available for 90-day prescriptions!
- No co-payment required for approximately 80 generic medications: "No Cost Drug List" available on website
- Ambulance transport has been reduced from \$100 to \$50.
- \*\*On-campus CU-EMS continues to be at no added cost.\*\*

#### Off Campus Mental Health Services

Great news!

- \$0.00 co-pay for first 10 visits to an off-campus, in-network provider
- After the first 10 visits, the \$20 co-pay will apply
- \*\*On-campus visits with CPS continues to be at no cost\*\*
